**RESPONSE TO COMISSION STAFF'S EXCEPTIONS TO
HEARING EXAMINER'S REPORT**

Delmarva Power & Light Company ("Delmarva"), by and through its undersigned counsel, hereby responds to the Exceptions filed by Public Service Commission Staff ("Staff") to the Hearing Examiner's Report in this Docket filed on March 19, 2015.

1. In its Exceptions to the Hearing Examiner's Report, filed on April 8, 2015, Staff agrees with the findings of the Hearing Examiner that the complaint involving Dawn Voll was "solely a billing issue and should be dismissed with prejudice"¹; however, Staff then proceeds to argue that the Hearing Examiner erred in not finding that Delmarva should pursue collection actions against Ms. Voll for her unpaid balance.

2. In as much as the Public Service Commission ("Commission") does not have jurisdiction and authority over billing disputes², it also does not have

jurisdiction over the specific manner in which Delmarva pursues collection of the unpaid bills of an individual customer. See *Georgia-Pacific Corp. v. Delmarva Power & Light Co.*, 1992 WL 396307 at *6, citing *Artesian Water Company v. Cynwyd Club Apts.*, 297 A. 2d 387 (Del 1972)³. Delmarva has an established debt collection process that it follows for customers and has been effectively reducing the amount of bad debt for several years now.


3. Considering Staff's agreement that the courts of this State have determined that the Commission lacks jurisdiction over billing disputes, it is incongruous to claim that the Commission can, nevertheless, direct Delmarva to take legal action to collect the debt of a particular customer under the general jurisdictional provisions of 26 *Del. C.* §201(a).

4. Ms. Voll brought her complaint to the Commission. Staff agrees that the Hearing Examiner has correctly determined that the Commission has no jurisdiction over Ms. Voll's claim because it is a billing dispute. For Staff to agree that no jurisdiction exists, while at the same time arguing that the Commission does have jurisdiction to order specific legal action to be taken against Ms. Voll defies both logic and established Delaware law.

³ To be clear, the Commission does have the authority to determine, in a rate case, whether Delmarva has failed to appropriately pursue collections of unpaid bills on the whole; however, it lacks jurisdiction over the day to day operations of the utility such as the manner in which Delmarva Power addresses a purely legal billing dispute with an individual customer. *Application of Wilmington Suburban Water Corp.*, Del. Super., 203 A 2d 817 (1964), *aff'd Delmarva Power & Light Company v. Public Service Commission*, Del. Supr., 508 A. 2d 849 (1986).

WHEREFORE, for the reasons stated herein, Delmarva respectfully requests that Staff's Exception to the Hearing Examiner's Report be denied, with prejudice.
