ORDER NO. 6834

This 7th day of February, 2006, the Commission determines and Orders the following:

1. In PSC Order No. 6806 (Jan. 10, 2006), the Commission directed Inland Bays Preservation Company, L.L.C. ("Inland Bays") to file responses to particular information requests earlier posed by Staff. Inland Bays had until January 24, 2006 to submit such responses. If it did not do so, it was directed to show cause before the Commission on February 7, 2006, why sanctions should not be imposed.

2. In a letter to the Commission dated January 19, 2006, counsel for Inland Bays reported that the chief executive and operating officer for the utility was currently out of the country and would not return home until the first week in February. Counsel suggested that given Inland Bays' size, the officer was needed to compile and complete the called-for responses. Counsel asked the Commission to extend the time for compliance until March 1, 2006.

3. Based on counsel's representations, the Commission will grant Inland Bays a one-time extension to file its responses. Inland Bays shall have until Wednesday, March 1, 2006 to provide the

documents and information required under Order No. 6806. If it does not make such submissions on or before such date, Inland Bays shall appear before the Commission on March 14, 2006 to show cause why Inland Bays should not be sanctioned (as outlined in paragraph 7 and Ordering paragraph 2 of Order No. 6806). No further extensions should be expected. The Commission is under a statutory directive to act promptly to approve, disapprove, or modify the rates charged by Inland Bays, a grandfathered public wastewater utility. See 26 Del. C. § 301(c) (2004 Supp.). Finally, the Commission expresses some concerns that this utility, supposedly serving approximately 900 customers in its existing service territory, is apparently unable to provide information about its operations unless its chief officer is present. One would expect that there would be others who could, upon direction, provide to Staff the somewhat "routine" information requested.

Now, therefore, **IT IS ORDERED:**

1. That, for the reasons set forth above, the deadline for Inland Bays Preservation Company, L.L.C. to submit the documents and information described in Ordering paragraph 1 of PSC Order No. 6806 (Jan. 10, 2006) is hereby extended to, and including, March 1, 2006. If Inland Bays Preservation Company, L.L.C. does not submit such documents and information to the Commission on or before such date, then Inland Bays Preservation Company, L.L.C. shall appear before the Commission at 1:00 P.M. on Tuesday, March 14, 2006, to show cause as called for by paragraph 7 and Ordering paragraph 2 of PSC Order No. 6806 (Jan. 10, 2006). The notices as to procedural protections set

forth in Order No. 6806 would continue to apply to the new potential show cause date.

2. The Commission reserves the jurisdiction and authority to enter such other or further Orders in this matter as may be deemed necessary or proper.
