ORDER NO. 7285

AND NOW, to wit, this 18th day of September, 2007, Delmarva Power & Light Company ("DP&L" or "the Company"), having, on September 4, 2007, filed with the Commission the above-captioned application seeking approval to modify its Gas Cost Rates ("GCR") and confirmation of related calculations to "true-up" costs and credits associated with the Large Volume Gas service and for "electing" customers under the Medium Volume Gas service;

AND, the Commission having determined, pursuant to 26 Del. C. §§ 304 and 306, that the proposed GCR and other requested modifications to the Company's tariffs should be permitted to become effective, but subject to refund, for usage on and after November 1, 2007 with proration pending further review and a final decision by the Commission; now therefore,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That pursuant to 26 Del. C. §§ 304 and 306, the proposed changes to Gas Cost Service rates, and accompanying proposed tariff revision set forth in the application filed by Delmarva Power & Light Company on September 4, 2007, are allowed to go into effect for gas usage on or after November 1, 2007, with proration, pending a final

decision of the Commission. Such rates shall be subject to refund depending upon such final decision.

2. That Ruth Ann Price is designated as the Hearing Examiner for this docket pursuant to 26 Del. C. § 502 and 29 Del. C. ch. 101. Hearing Examiner Price shall schedule and conduct such public evidentiary hearings as may be necessary or appropriate to develop a full and complete record concerning this matter. Hearing Examiner Price shall thereafter report to the Commission her proposed findings and recommendations based on the evidence presented. Pursuant to Rule 21 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure, Hearing Examiner Price is delegated the authority to grant or deny petitions to intervene. In addition, Hearing Examiner Price is delegated the authority under 26 Del. C. § 102A to determine the content, form, and manner of any further notice in this matter. James McC. Geddes, Esquire, is designated as Rate Counsel for this matter.

3. That Delmarva Power & Light Company shall give public notice of the filing of this application with the proposed rate changes and this action by the Commission, by publishing notice in the form attached hereto as Exhibit "A" in two-column format, outlined in black, in the legal classified section of The News Journal newspaper on September 25 and 26, 2007. Delmarva Power & Light Company shall submit proof of such publication as soon as possible, but no later than the commencement of the evidentiary hearings concerning this matter.

4. That Delmarva Power & Light Company is hereby put on notice that it will be charged the costs incurred in connection with this proceeding under the provisions of 26 Del. C. § 114(b)(1).

5. That the Commission reserves the jurisdiction and authority to enter such further Orders in this matter as may be deemed necessary or proper.

DP&L's Gas Cost Rate Case, PSC Docket No. 07-239F

Pursuant to 26 Del. C. §§ 304 and 306, Delmarva Power & Light Company ("DP&L" or "the Company"), has filed an application with the Public Service Commission ("the Commission") seeking to change its Gas Cost Rates ("GCR") in the following manner:

The effect on a residential space heating customer using 120 ccf in a winter month would be a decrease of \$7.01, or 4.0%, in their total bill.

In addition, the Application requests approval of the Company's proposal to reconcile and true-up actual versus estimated Weighted Average Commodity Cost of Gas ("WACCOG") assignments for sales under the Large Volume Gas service and for so-called "electing" customers taking service under the Medium Volume Gas service and for sales made under the Flexibly Prices Sales Service ("FPS").

The Commission has permitted the proposed Gas Cost Rates and other rate related modifications to become effective as of November 1, 2007, subject to refund after evidentiary hearings and further proceedings. The Commission's action on this Application will be based upon the evidence presented at evidentiary hearings to be scheduled at a later date.

Any person or group wishing to participate formally as a party in this docket (PSC Docket No. 07-239F), with the right to submit evidence and to be represented by counsel must, in accordance with Rule 21 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, petition the Commission for and be granted leave to intervene in the proceedings in this docket. To be timely, all such petitions must be filed with the Commission at 861 Silver Lake Boulevard, Cannon

Building, Suite 100, Dover, Delaware 19904 on or before October 26, 2007. Petitions received thereafter will not be considered except for good cause shown.
