**ORDER NO. 7588**

**GRANTING CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY  
TO PROVIDE PUBLIC WATER UTILITY SERVICES**

This 16<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2009, the Commission finds, determines, and Orders the following:

1. On February 17, 2009, Tidewater Utilities, Inc. ("Tidewater" or "Applicant") filed an application ("Application") with the Commission seeking a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CPCN") to expand its facilities and operations in order to provide water services to one parcel of land located southwest of Seaford, one parcel of land located west of Bridgeville, and one parcel of land located east of Georgetown, Sussex County, Delaware ("Proposed Service Area"). The basis for the Application is Tidewater's possession of petitions requesting water services signed by all of the owners of the parcels of land comprising the Proposed Service Area in accordance with 26 *Del. C.* § 203C(e)(1)b. With its Application, Tidewater filed evidence that it had mailed to all of the landowners in the Proposed Service Area notice of its application and the options available to the affected landowners. In addition, on Staff's direction, Tidewater published notice of its Application in

two newspapers of general circulation. No comments regarding the Applicant or this Application have been received.

3. On May 28, 2009, Tidewater amended its Application to remove one parcel of land from the Proposed Service Area (the parcel in Bridgeville - Sussex County Tax Map Parcel Number 131-12.00-43.00). There are now two parcels of land in the Proposed Service Area.

4. The Commission Staff has completed its review and investigation of the Application and the Applicant. In a May 26, 2009 Memorandum to the Commission, Staff reports that Tidewater's Application meets all requirements for the granting of a CPCN under 26 *Del. C. § 203C* and the Commission's *Regulations Governing Water Utilities Including the Public Service Commission's Jurisdiction to Grant and Revoke Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity*, and recommends approval of the Application.

5. For these reasons, the Commission finds that Tidewater has met all requirements for the granting of a CPCN and, therefore, the Commission shall approve the Application in PSC Docket No. 09-CPCN-08 as filed on February 17, 2009 and amended on May 28, 2009.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE AFFIRMATIVE  
VOTE OF NOT FEWER THAN THREE COMMISSIONERS:**

1. That, pursuant to 26 *Del. C. § 203C(e)*, to the extent it is consistent with this Order, a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity is granted to Tidewater Utilities, Inc. to serve the area more specifically identified by Sussex County Tax Map Parcels Numbers 234-18.00-53.02 and 531-15.00-80.00.

2. That Tidewater Utilities, Inc., shall comply with any and all federal, state, county, and local statutes, ordinances, orders, regulations, rules, and permit conditions that are applicable, or may become applicable, to any matter involving water utility services provided to the service territory granted by this Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity.

3. That Tidewater Utilities, Inc. is hereby placed on notice that the costs of this proceeding will be charged to it under the provisions of 26 Del. C. § 114(b)(1).

4. That the Commission reserves the jurisdiction and authority to enter such further Orders in this matter as may be deemed necessary or proper.
