ELECTRIC SUPPLIER CERTIFICATE

This 28th day of June, 2016, the Public Service Commission (the "Commission") determines and orders the following:

WHEREAS, on February 20, 2015, Everyday Energy, LLC D/B/A Energy Rewards F/K/A FTR Energy Services ("Energy Rewards" or the "Company") submitted to the Commission an incomplete application¹ pursuant to 26 Del. C. §1001 - §1020, the Electric Utility Restructuring Act (the "Act"), and 26 Del. Admin. C. §3001, the Commission's Rules for Certification and Regulation of Electric Suppliers (the "Supplier Rules").² The incomplete application requested certification for Energy Rewards as a retail electric supplier in order to broker the sale or purchase of Electric Supply Service. This incomplete application was docketed as PSC Docket No. 15-0711; and

WHEREAS, over a 12 month period of time, the Commission Staff ("Staff") sent two notices of deficiencies to Energy Rewards in an

attempt to correct deficiencies in the incomplete application including confirmation that the Company intends to operate as a retail electric supplier, rather than a broker of electric supply services³;and

WHEREAS, on March 22, 2016, Energy Rewards submitted the documentation required to meet the minimum filing requirements of an electric supplier certification application (the "Application"), in accordance with the Act and Supplier Rules. ; and

WHEREAS, in the Application, the Company requested certification as a retail electric supplier⁴ and stated it will utilize appropriate energy procurement strategies to meet the needs of residential, small commercial, large commercial, and industrial customers in Delaware; and

WHEREAS, as required by §3001-2.2 of the Supplier Rules, Energy Rewards provided to Staff the appropriate affidavits of publication showing that notice of the Application was published in the Delaware State News on January 29, 2016, and in the News Journal on February 26, 2016. Staff has confirmed that no one has filed any interventions, protests, or comments in this docket to date; and

³ Under Section 3001-2.4 of the Supplier Rules, applications that do not include the necessary supporting documentation or information may be rejected. In addition, "[t]he Commission Staff will provide the Applicant with a list of deficiencies and the Applicant will be given time to provide the necessary information to complete its certification. However, an incomplete or abandoned application will be closed four (4) months after the filing date, unless such time frame is extended by the Commission."

⁴ Pursuant to §1001(3) of the Act, "Electric Supplier" is defined as an entity or person certified by the Commission, including municipal corporations which choose to provide electricity outside their municipal limits (except to the extent provided prior to February 1, 1999), Broker, Marketer or other entity (including public utilities and their affiliates, e.g., Delmarva), that sells electricity to Retail Electric Customers, utilizing the Transmission and Distribution Facilities of an Electric Distribution Company.

WHEREAS, as more specifically detailed in its Memorandum to the Commission, Staff reports that the Application fulfills all of the requirements set forth in the Act and the Supplier Rules for an Electric Supplier Certificate to provide electric supply services and that the Company has specifically presented substantial evidence to support its financial, operational, managerial, and technical ability to operate as an Electric Supplier within the State of Delaware. Therefore, Staff recommends that the Commission issue an Electric Supplier Certificate to authorize the Company to provide Electric Supply Services in the State of Delaware;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF NOT FEWER THAN THREE COMMISSIONERS:

1. Energy Rewards is hereby granted a certificate to do business and operate as an Electric Supplier within the State of Delaware. Under this Electric Supplier Certificate, the Company is authorized to provide Electric Supply Service within the State of Delaware consistent with and in accordance with the Act and the Supplier Rules.

2. Energy Rewards is hereby notified that a violation of any applicable order, statute, regulation, rule, or other controlling authority may be enforced by sanctions permitted by §§1012(a) and 1019 of the Act and §3001-10.2 of the Supplier Rules.

3. Energy Rewards shall file such reports and pay such fees and assessments as may be required or imposed by §§114, 115 and 1012(c)(2) of the Act and §§3001-3.9 and 3.10 of the Supplier Rules.

4. Energy Rewards consents to the jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Delaware for all acts or omissions related to its offering of Electric Supply Services in this State.

5. Energy Rewards is hereby placed on notice that the costs of this proceeding will be charged to it pursuant to §114(b)(1) of the Act.

6. The Commission reserves the jurisdiction and authority to enter such further Orders in this matter as may be deemed necessary or proper.
