Pursuant to the responsibility assigned by the 147th General Assembly, Senate Substitute No. 1 for Senate Bill 160, FY2016 Bond and Capital Improvements Act of the State of Delaware, Section 68, the Electricity Affordability Committee ("EAC") submitted a petition (the "Petition") requesting the Public Service Commission (the "Commission") to review the Customer Choice recommendations contained in the EAC report and to implement those actions the Commission feels will enhance opportunity for customer choice in Delaware, help lower energy supply costs for electric customers and are in the public interest.

The Commission has appointed Hearing Examiner Mark Lawrence to conduct public hearings as may be necessary or appropriate to develop a full and complete record concerning this matter, to be scheduled at

Petitions filed after the deadline of March 20, 2016, will not be considered except for good cause shown.
