On September 14, 2016, FreedomVoice and GoDaddy Operating Company, LLC (“GoDaddy Operating”) (collectively, the “Applicants”), filed an application (“Application”) with the Delaware Public Service Commission (“Commission”) pursuant to 26 Del. C. § 215, seeking approval of the transfer of control of FreedomVoice to GoDaddy Operating, as well as a subsequent *pro forma* transaction in which FreedomVoice’s authorization to provide telecommunications services will be assigned to GoDaddy.com, LLC, an affiliate of GoDaddy Operating.

Any person who wishes to protest or to comment upon this application must do so in a written document filed with the Commission *on or before October 31, 2016*.

If you wish to formally participate as a party in this matter, with the right to present evidence and be represented by counsel, you must file with the Commission a petition asking for leave to intervene in accordance with the requirements of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (26 *Del. Admin. C.* §1001-2.9) ***on or before October 31, 2016***. All such petitions should be filed in DelaFile according to the Commission's Rules (26 *Del. Admin. C.* §1001-1.6.4).

You are invited to review the Applicant's filed application and supporting documents to determine how your interests may be affected.
