ORDER NO. 7849

AND NOW, this 21st day of September, 2010:

WHEREAS, on September 1, 2010 Chesapeake Utilities Corporation ("Chesapeake" or "the Company") filed with the Delaware Public Service Commission (the "Commission") the above-captioned application (the "Application") seeking approval to change its Gas Sales Service Rates ("GSR") effective on November 1, 2010, as follows: (1) increase the Company's current GSR rate from \$0.956 per Ccf to \$1.035 per Ccf for customers served under rate schedules RS-1, RS-2, GS, MVS and LVS; (2) increase the Company's current GSR rate from \$0.645 per Ccf to \$0.668 per Ccf for customers served under rate schedules GLR and GLO; (3) increase the Company's current GSR rate from \$0.797 per Ccf to \$0.863 per Ccf for customers served under rate schedule HLFS; (4) decrease the Company's firm balancing rate for transportation customers served under rate schedule LVS from \$0.056 per Ccf to \$0.054 per Ccf; (5) increase the Company's firm balancing rate for transportation customers served under rate schedule HLFS from \$0.007 per Ccf to \$0.010 per Ccf; and (6) decrease the Company's interruptible balancing rate for transportation customers served under rate schedule ITS from \$0.002 per Ccf to \$0.001 per Ccf; and

WHEREAS, the Commission having determined, pursuant to 26 *Del. C.* §§304 and 306, that the proposed GSR changes should be permitted to become effective for usage on and after November 1, 2010, subject to refund, pending the Commission's further review and final decision;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF NOT FEWER THAN THREE COMMISSIONERS:

1. That pursuant to 26 *Del. C.* §§303(b), §§304 and 306, the following proposed changes to the Gas Sales Service rates, firm balancing rates and interruptible balancing rate of Chesapeake Utilities Corporation, and the accompanying proposed tariff revisions set forth in the Application, are permitted to become effective for natural gas usage on or after November 1, 2010, subject to refund pending the Commission's final decision:

2. That Mark Lawrence is designated as the Hearing Examiner for this docket pursuant to 26 *Del. C.* §502 and 29 *Del. C.* ch. 101. Hearing Examiner Lawrence shall schedule and conduct such public evidentiary hearings as may be necessary or appropriate to develop a full and complete record concerning this matter. Hearing Examiner Lawrence shall thereafter report to the Commission his proposed

findings and recommendations based on the evidence presented. Pursuant to Rule 21 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure, Hearing Examiner Lawrence is delegated the authority to grant or deny petitions to intervene. In addition, Hearing Examiner Lawrence is delegated the authority under 26 Del. C. §102A to determine the content, form, and manner of any further notice in this matter and to grant applications of counsel for admission *pro hac vice*.

3. That Chesapeake Utilities Corporation shall give public notice of the filing of this application with the proposed rate changes and this action by the Commission, by publishing notice in the form attached hereto as Exhibit "A" in two-column format, outlined in black, in the legal classified section of The News Journal newspaper on **Wednesday, October 13, 2010** and the Delaware State News newspaper on **Thursday, October 14, 2010**. Chesapeake Utilities Corporation shall submit proof of such publication as soon as possible, but no later than the commencement of the evidentiary hearings concerning this matter.

4. That Chesapeake Utilities Corporation is hereby put on notice that it will be charged the costs incurred in connection with this proceeding under the provisions of 26 Del. C. §114(b)(1).

5. That the Commission reserves the jurisdiction and authority to enter such further Orders in this matter as may be deemed necessary or proper.

**TO: ALL NATURAL GAS CUSTOMERS OF CHESAPEAKE UTILITIES CORPORATION
AND OTHER INTERESTED PERSONS**

Pursuant to 26 Del. C. §§ 303(b), 304 and 306, Chesapeake Utilities Corporation ("Chesapeake" or "the Company") has filed an application with the Delaware Public Service Commission (the Commission") seeking to change its Gas Sales Service ("GSR") Rates as follows:

Rate Schedule	Present Rate	Proposed Rate
RS-1, RS-2, GS, MVS, LVS	\$0.956 per Ccf	\$1.035 per Ccf
GLR, GLO	\$0.645 per Ccf	\$0.668 per Ccf
HLFS	\$0.797 per Ccf	\$0.863 per Ccf

Compared to the rates currently in effect, an average RS-2 customer using 700 Ccf per year will experience an annual increase of approximately 5%, or \$4.50 per month. During the winter heating season, a typical RS-2 customer using 110 Ccf per month will experience an increase of approximately 6%, or \$8.50 per winter month. A typical RS-2 customer using 120 Ccf per winter month will experience an increase of approximately 6%, or \$9.50 per winter month.

The Company has also proposed the following changes to its firm and interruptible transportation balancing rates:

The Commission has permitted the proposed GSR and other rates to become effective with usage on and after November 1, 2010, subject to refund after evidentiary hearings and any other proceedings that may be necessary.

The Commission will conduct an evidentiary hearing, to be scheduled at a later date, concerning this application. The Commission's final decision will be based on the evidence presented at such hearing.

Any person, group or entity desiring to participate formally as a party in this docket, with the right to submit evidence and to be represented by counsel, must petition the Commission for and be granted leave to intervene in the proceedings in accordance with Rule 21 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. To be timely, all such petitions must be filed with the Commission at 861 Silver Lake Boulevard, Cannon Building, Suite 100, Dover, Delaware 19904 (Attn: PSC Dkt. No. 10-296F) on or before **Thursday, November 4, 2010**. Petitions received thereafter will not be considered except for good cause shown.
