ELECTRIC SUPPLIER CERTIFICATE

This 18th day of November, 2010, the Commission determines and orders the following:

1. On September 15, 2010, Clearview Electric, Inc. ("Clearview" or "Company"), filed an amended application seeking certification as a retail electric supplier (the "Application"). See 26 Del. C. §§ 1001(2), 1001(11), 1012(a). Under the Electric Utilities Restructuring Act of 1999 (the "Act"),¹ "electric suppliers" are not "public utilities" and the resulting sales of electric supply service to retail customers are not subject to traditional forms of rate-regulation. See 26 Del. C. §§ 102(2), 202(f).

2. In its Application, Clearview reports that it is an electric supplier that will be providing retail energy service to residential or small commercial customers.

3. Staff reports that Clearview was able to resolve concerns regarding the provision of electric supply service to residential and small commercial customers on a monthly variable rate basis. On balance, therefore, the Company's application fulfills all the

requirements for an Electric Supplier Certificate to act as an electric supplier as set forth in the Commission's Rules for Certification and Regulations of Electric Suppliers (the "ES Rules"). In particular, Staff reports that the Company appears to possess the financial, operational, managerial, and technical capabilities to operate as an electric supplier. As required by Section 2.2 of the ES Rules, the Company provided the appropriate affidavits of publication of notice of their application in the Delaware State News and The News Journal. Staff confirms that there were no comments, interventions, or protests filed in the instant docket within the required 20-day notice period. Based on Staff's report, the Commission issues an Electric Supplier Certificate to Clearview allowing it to offer electric supply services in this State consistent with the scheme adopted by the Act and the ES Rules.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF NOT FEWER THAN THREE COMMISSIONERS:

1. That, pursuant to 26 *Del. C.* § 1012(a) and the Commission's "Rules for Certification and Regulations of Electric Suppliers", Clearview Electric, Inc., is hereby granted a certificate to operate as an "Electric Supplier" within this State. Under this certificate, Clearview Electric, Inc. is authorized to provide Electric Supply Service within this State in accord with 26 *Del. C.* ch. 10.

2. That Clearview Electric, Inc. shall at all times provide its Electric Supply Service in accordance with the requirements imposed by 26 *Del. C.* ch. 10 and the Commission's "Rules for Certification and Regulations of Electric Suppliers" as presently adopted, or as may be hereafter amended or supplemented. Clearview

Electric, Inc. is hereby notified that a violation of any applicable statute, rule or other controlling authority may be enforced by the sanctions permitted by 26 Del. C. § 1012(a) and § 10.2 of the "Rules for Certification and Regulations of Electric Suppliers".

3. That Clearview Electric, Inc. shall, pursuant to the provisions of 26 Del. C. § 1012(c)(2) and §§ 3.9 and 3.10 of the "Rules for Certification and Regulations of Electric Suppliers," file such reports and pay such fees and assessments as may be required, or may be imposed, by 26 Del. C. §§ 114 and 115.

4. That Clearview Electric, Inc. consents to the jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Delaware for all acts or omissions related to its offering of electric supply services in this State.

5. That Clearview Electric, Inc. is hereby placed on notice that the costs of the proceedings will be charged to it under the provisions of 26 Del. C. § 114(b)(1).

6. That the Commission reserves the jurisdiction and authority to enter such further Orders in this matter as may be deemed necessary or proper.
