ORDER NO. 8535

AND NOW, this 20th day of February, 2014, the Delaware Public Service Commission ("Commission") determines and orders the following:

WHEREAS, on January 27, 2014, pursuant to 26 Del. C. §351 et seq., Delmarva Power & Light Company ("Delmarva") filed an application (the "Application") with the Commission requesting approval of its 2014 Program for the Procurement of Solar Renewable Energy Credits (the "2014 Program"); and

WHEREAS, the 2014 Program is based on requirements set forth in the Renewable Energy Portfolio Standards Act ("REPSA") which was enacted in 2007 and amended in subsequent years. See 26 Del. C. §§351 - 364. The 2011 Amendments made Delmarva responsible for procuring RECs¹ and SRECs² necessary for compliance with respect to all energy delivered to Delmarva's distribution customers beginning in compliance year 2012 (June 2012 - May 2013); and

WHEREAS, the 2014 Program is based on recommendations of the Renewable Energy Taskforce (the "Taskforce"), which is charged with making such recommendations to the Commission and other entities. 3 See

26 Del. C. §§360(d), (d)(2), and (d)(3). The 2014 Program is also based on the Pilot Program⁴ and the 2013 Program for the Procurement of Solar Renewable Energy Credits (the "Pilot Program" and "2013 Program"), but the Taskforce developed and which the Commission previously approved; and

WHEREAS, per Order No. 8450, the Commission retained a consultant (New Energy Opportunities, Inc. or "New Energy")⁶ to conduct an independent review of the 2013 Program for compliance with the recommendations of the Commission Staff ("Staff") and the Taskforce and to examine associated issues, including, but not limited to:

- a. The robustness of the response to the solicitation;
- b. The structure of the solicitation with regard to tiers;

matters related thereto: a. Establishing balanced markets mechanisms for REC and SREC trading; b. Establishing REC and SREC aggregation mechanisms and other devices to encourage the deployment of renewable, distributed renewable, and solar energy technologies in Delaware with the least impact on retail electricity suppliers, municipal electric companies and rural electric cooperatives; c. After an analysis by the Taskforce, the annual progress towards achieving the minimum cumulative percentages for all renewable energy resources including, but not limited to, solar and other eligible energy resources and making appropriate recommendations based upon deliberate and factual analysis and study; d. Minimizing the cost for complying with any portion of this subchapter based upon deliberate and factual analysis and study; e. Establishing revenue certainty for appropriate investment in renewable energy technologies, including, but not limited to, consideration of long-term contracts and auction mechanisms; f. Establishing mechanisms to maximize in-state renewable energy generation and local manufacturing; and g. Ensuring that residential, commercial, and utility scale photovoltaic and solar thermal systems of various sizes are financially viable and costeffective investments in Delaware.

- c. The extent to which SREC prices should be determined by competitive bidding;
- d. The effect of the ${\tt SEU's}^7$ involvement in terms of cost of administration;
- e. The quality of the conduct of the solicitation; and WHEREAS, New Energy did provide the Commission with its independent review in the form of a report dated August, 7, 2013, as revised September 20, 2013; and

WHEREAS, in its Application, Delmarva requested that the Commission handle this matter on an expedited basis. Delmarva also stated in Exhibit "D" to its Application that the Taskforce recommended the next auction for SRECs begin no later than May 31, 2014, for the compliance year starting June 1, 2014; and

WHEREAS, Staff has reviewed the Application and recognizes that certain deadlines must be met for the SREC compliance year starting June 1, 2014. Hence, Staff agrees that expedited treatment should be given to the Application. Staff therefore will review all of the details of the 2014 Program for compliance with its previous recommendations set forth in the Pilot Program and the 2013 Program, as well as compliance with the Taskforce's recommendations;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF NOT FEWER THAN THREE COMMISSIONERS:

1. Pursuant to the requirements of 26 Del. C. §§102A and 304, Delmarva shall give public notice of the Application by causing the notice attached as **Exhibit "A"** to be published in the legal classified

section of <u>The News Journal</u> and <u>Delaware State News</u> newspapers in two-column format, outlined in black, on or before Friday, February 28, 2014. Delmarva is required to file in this docket affidavits of publication of such public notices as soon as possible, but not later than the commencement of the evidentiary hearings concerning this matter.

- 2. The deadline for filing written comments on the Application and for any petitions to intervene pursuant to 26 Del. Admin. C. §1001-2.9.2 shall be on or before Friday, March 21, 2014. Late-filed petitions to intervene will not be granted unless good cause is shown.
- 3. Pursuant to 26 Del. Admin. C. §§1001-2.1.1 and 2.9.3, the Commission designates to Hearing Examiner Mark Lawrence the authority solely to grant or deny petitions seeking leave to intervene and motions for admission of counsel pro hac vice.
- 4. The Commission directs Staff to prepare for its consideration a report on the Application and Staff's recommendations for any changes to the proposed 2014 Program. Staff shall submit such report to the Commission on or before April 4, 2014.
- 5. The Commission will conduct an evidentiary hearing on this matter at its regularly-scheduled meeting on Tuesday, April 15, 2014, beginning at 1:00 p.m. The Commission will make its decision on the Application based upon the entire record of the case.
- 6. The Commission Secretary shall promptly serve a copy of this Order on the Division of the Public Advocate.
