

**PUBLIC NOTICE OF THE APPLICATION OF CHESAPEAKE UTILITIES CORPORATION FOR
NATURAL GAS EXPANSION RATES OUTSIDE ITS EXISTING EXPANSION AREA
(PRESENTLY IN SOUTHEASTERN SUSSEX COUNTY) TO EXPAND THE AVAILABILITY
OF NATURAL GAS TO RESIDENTS, COMMUNITIES, AND BUSINESSES
THROUGHOUT THE REST OF ITS SERVICE TERRITORY IN DELAWARE**

TO: ALL NATURAL GAS CUSTOMERS OF CHESAPEAKE UTILITIES CORPORATION AND OTHER INTERESTED PERSONS:

On December 20, 2017, pursuant to 26 Del. C. §201, §301, and §304, Chesapeake Utilities Corporation ("Chesapeake") filed with the Delaware Public Service Commission ("the Commission") an application proposing to apply the Infrastructure Expansion Service ("IES") rates throughout its service territory when such rates are elected by the customers to be served and necessary to allow for expansion of availability of service to residents, communities, and businesses when economical and where natural gas service is not widely available.

In its application, Chesapeake has requested approval to apply the IES rates approved by the Commission in Order 8479 entered in PSC Docket No. 12-292 (the "Expansion Docket") to residents and businesses within Chesapeake's service territory if elected by the residents or businesses and where it is not otherwise economical for Chesapeake to provide service.

The IES rates are as follows:

Rate Schedule	Current Monthly Customer Charge	Proposed Monthly Customer Charge (if elected)
RS-1	\$13.50	\$16.50
RS-2	\$13.50	\$31.75
GS	\$31.50	\$56.00
MVS	\$80.00	\$158.75

On February 1, 2018, the Commission suspended the proposed changes and opened a proceeding to investigate the application. The Commission will render a decision after holding public evidentiary hearings, which will be conducted upon due public notice, and will render its decision based on the record evidence.

If the Commission does not receive any petitions to intervene, material objections, or written comments raising significant issues, the Commission may, by later order, rescind the designation of Mark Lawrence as the Hearing Examiner for this proceeding, and consider the matter after a duly noticed evidentiary hearing at a regularly-scheduled Commission meeting.

You are invited to review Chesapeake's application and supporting documents to determine how your interests may be affected by going to DelaFile (<https://delafile.delaware.gov>), the Commission's docketing and file management system, and by searching for Docket No. 17-1224.

If you wish to formally participate as a party in this matter, with the right to present evidence and be represented by counsel, you must file with the Commission a petition asking for leave to intervene in accordance with the requirements of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (26 Del. Admin. C. §1001-2.9) **on or before Friday, February 23, 2018**. All such petitions should be filed in DelaFile according to the Commission's Rules (26 Del. Admin. C. §1001-1.6.4). Petitions filed after the deadline of February 23, 2018, will not be considered except for good cause shown. Intervenors must comply with the procedural schedule in place at the time intervention is granted, including any deadlines that may have been established prior to the granting of intervenor status.



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

On December 20, 2017, the Delaware Division of Chesapeake Utilities Corporation ("Chesapeake" or the "Company") filed with the Commission an application proposing to apply the Infrastructure Expansion Service ("IES") rates throughout its service territory when such rates are elected by the customers to be served and necessary to allow for expansion of availability of service to residents, communities, and businesses when economical and where natural gas service is not widely available. If the application is approved, residents and businesses in underserved areas will be able to elect to pay higher monthly charges rather than paying the up-front contribution that otherwise would be required to support the cost of the natural gas mainline extension.

Public comment sessions are for the purpose of receiving statements from Chesapeake's customers and members of the public concerning the services being provided, the proposed application, and other matters that are the subject of this case. Evidentiary hearings are conducted to formally introduce evidence into the record and to make available for cross-examination the parties' witnesses' testimony. Anyone who plans to attend a Public Comment Session or the Evidentiary Hearing is cautioned to consult the Commission's website on the day of the respective proceeding for cancellation or changes to the time, place or date of the event. People who wish to comment on the Company's service quality or would like to share their experiences regarding the Company's services, but who are unable to attend one of the public comment sessions, may file written comments with the Commission no later than June 22, 2018. Please direct written comments to Jason R. Smith, Public Utility Analyst, Delaware Public Service Commission, 861 Silver Lake Boulevard, Cannon Building, Suite 100, Dover, Delaware 19904. Comments may be also be sent electronically to Mr. Smith at jason.r.smith@state.de.us.

Evidentiary hearings are conducted to formally introduce evidence into the record and to make available for cross-examination the parties' witnesses' testimony. In the event the parties reach a settlement, an evidentiary hearing will be conducted to determine whether the proposed settlement is in the public interest. Members of the public are invited to attend the evidentiary hearings as observers, and may have the opportunity to offer public comment, but only the parties are permitted to present witnesses or cross-examine witnesses. In accordance with 26 Del. C. §305 and 29 Del. C. §10128, the Commission will make its decision concerning this matter on the basis of the record evidence presented to the Commission at the public evidentiary hearing.

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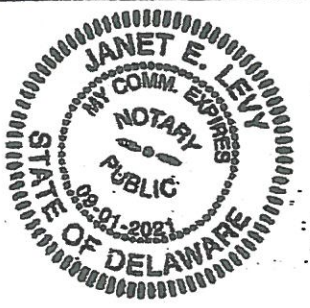
