The effect on a residential space heating customer using 83 ccf in a winter month would be a decrease of \$3.73, or 4.1%, in the customer's total bill. Customers served on Service Classification GG would experience a decrease on their bills ranging between 1.4% and 5.4%, while customers served on Service Classification MVG would experience a decrease on their bills ranging between 4.8% and 7.1%, depending upon their load and usage characteristics.

By Order No. 9655 dated September 30, 2020, the Commission permitted the proposed rates to become effective with usage on and after November 1, 2020, subject to modification and refund after an evidentiary hearing.

Evidentiary hearings are conducted to formally introduce evidence into the record and to make available for cross-examination the parties' witness testimony. Members of the public are invited to attend the evidentiary hearings, but only the parties are permitted to present evidence or cross-examine witnesses. The Commission will make its decision on this matter on the basis of the record evidence taken at the April 21, 2021 evidentiary hearing, at which the parties intend

to present a Proposed Settlement to the Commission. The Commission's evidentiary hearing will address whether the Proposed Settlement is in the public interest and results in just and reasonable rates. The Commission may approve or reject, in whole or in part, the Proposed Settlement.
