PUBLIC NOTICE

On Wednesday, November 17, 2021, at 1:00 pm, the Delaware Public Service Commission (“Commission”) will consider Delmarva Power & Light Company’s (“Delmarva Power”) application for changes in its Electric Tariff related to Standard Offer Service rates, Procurement Cost Adjustment, and Reasonable Allowance for Retail Margin (“Application”). The evidentiary hearing will be held during the regularly scheduled Commission meeting at the Commission’s office located at 861 Silver Lake Boulevard, Cannon Building, Suite 100, Dover, Delaware 19904. (Please check the Commission’s agenda for its November 17, 2021 meeting for information regarding the hearing location. If restrictions on public gatherings are still in place due to the State of Emergency, the hearing may be accessible only by teleconference and live video streaming. The agenda will be posted on November 10, 2021, on the Commission’s website: <https://depssc.delaware.gov/public-meetings/>). The Commission will render a decision based upon the evidence presented to it at this evidentiary hearing. This public evidentiary hearing is being held in accordance with 26 *Del. C.* § 503 and 29 *Del. C.* §§ 10122, 10124, and 10125.

On May 4, 2021, Delmarva Power caused notice to be published in the *Delaware State News*, *Cape Gazette*, and *The News Journal* regarding the public comment period and the intervention period for this docket, both of which ended on June 25, 2021.

Evidentiary hearings are conducted to formally introduce evidence into the record and to make available for cross-examination the parties' witnesses. Such evidence may include testimony offered with respect to any settlement agreement that may be reached by the parties prior to the hearing. Members of the public are invited to attend the evidentiary hearing as observers, but only the parties are permitted to present or cross-examine witnesses. Following the conclusion of the evidentiary hearing, the Commission will make its decision concerning this matter on the basis of the record evidence presented at the public evidentiary hearing.

Anyone who plans to attend the evidentiary hearing should consult the Commission's website on the day of the hearing for cancellation of or changes in the time, place, or date of the event.
