PUBLIC NOTICE

TO: ALL NATURAL GAS CUSTOMERS OF CHESAPEAKE UTILTIES CORPORATION AND OTHER INTERESTED PERSONS

On November 1, 2023, Chesapeake Utilities Corporation ("Chesapeake" or the "Company") filed an application (the "Application") with the Delaware Public Service Commission (the "Commission") seeking approval to increase its Environmental Rider ("ER") rate from \$0.0009 per Ccf to \$0.0011 per Ccf under the process approved in PSC Order No. 4104 (December 19, 1995) in Docket No. 95-73. The rate will be effective with usage on and after December 1, 2023, with proration, subject to modification and refund after an evidentiary hearing. For a typical residential heating customer using 120 Ccf of gas per month, the proposed ER rate will increase approximately 0.013%, adding \$0.02 to their total bill. The Commission has approved the proposed rates to become effective with usage on and after December 1, 2023, with proration, subject to modification and refund after an evidentiary hearing.

The Commission will make its decision on the matter on the basis of the record evidence taken at an evidentiary hearing to be held at its regularly scheduled meeting on **Wednesday**, **April 17, 2024**, **starting at 1:00 p.m.** at 861 Silver Lake Boulevard, 1st Floor Hearing Room, Cannon Building, Dover, Delaware 19904. In addition, the Commission will accept public comments on the Application prior to the commencement of the evidentiary hearing on April 17, 2024.

You are invited to review Chesapeake's Application and supporting documents to determine how your interests may be affected by going to DelaFile (http://delafile.delaware.gov), the Commission's file management system, and by searching for Docket No. 23-1412.

Interested persons or entities may file comments or objections to the proposed change in the ER rate. Such comments or objections shall be filed *on or before March 15*, *2024* using DelaFile. Comments or objections shall also be served on the following people:

If you wish to formally participate as a party in this matter, with the right to present evidence and be represented by counsel, you must file with the Commission a petition asking for leave to intervene in accordance with the requirements of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (26 *Del. Admin. C.* §1001-2.9) *on or before March 15, 2024*. All such petitions should also be filed in DelaFile pursuant to 26 *Del. Admin. C.* §1001-1.6.4 and served on the people

identified above. Petitions for intervention that are not received by the Commission *on or before*March 15, 2024, will not be granted unless good cause is shown. If intervention status is granted, any intervenor wishing to oppose the Application must file pre-filed testimony with the Commission on or before March 28, 2024. Any submissions sent by an intervenor that are not received by the Commission on or before March 28, 2024 will not be considered. Such submissions shall be filed using DelaFile to be served on the persons identified above.
