The Delaware Public Service Commission (“Commission”) will conduct a public evidentiary hearing concerning the above-captioned case (as further explained below) at the following time and location:

On March 27, 2024, Delmarva Power & Light Company (“Delmarva” or the “Company”) filed with the Commission an application requesting changes to its Electric Tariff related to its Standard Offer Service rates, Procurement Cost Adjustment, and Reasonable Allowance for Retail Margin (“Application”). According to the Company’s calculations, not including the Qualified Fuel Cell Provider Project (“Bloom”) or Renewable Portfolio Standards (“RPS”) Charge, the monthly bill for a residential customer using 811 kWh on an annual average basis will increase by

approximately \$2.34 (or an increase of 1.65%).

On May 14, 2024, Delmarva Power caused notice to be published in the *Delaware State News*, *Cape Gazette*, and *The News Journal* regarding the public comment period and the intervention period for this docket, which ended on June 24, 2024.

Evidentiary hearings are conducted to formally introduce evidence into the record and to make available for cross-examination the parties' witnesses. Such evidence may include testimony offered with respect to any settlement agreement that may be reached by the parties prior to the hearing. Members of the public are invited to attend the evidentiary hearing, but only the parties are permitted to present or cross-examine witnesses. Following the conclusion of the evidentiary hearing, the Commission will make its decision concerning this matter on the basis of the record evidence presented at the public evidentiary hearing. This hearing is being held in accordance with 26 *Del. C.* § 503 and 29 *Del. C.* §§ 10122, 10124, and 10125.

Anyone who plans to attend the evidentiary hearing should consult the Commission's website on the day of the hearing for cancellation of or changes in the time, place, or date of the event.
