**PUBLIC NOTICE OF THE APPLICATION OF DELMARVA POWER & LIGHT
COMPANY FOR AN ALTERNATIVE FORM OF RATE REGULATION**

TO: ALL ELECTRIC CUSTOMERS OF DELMARVA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY:

On July 17, 2024, Delmarva Power & Light Company ("Delmarva" or "the Company") filed application with the Delaware Public Service Commission ("Commission") seeking approval of an alternative form of rate regulation called a Performance-Based Plan which bases rate recovery on future forecasted test periods that are paired with customer protections called Earning Sharing Mechanisms and often includes performance metrics called Performance Incentive Mechanisms. Delmarva claims that Performance-Based Plans introduce greater predictability, new opportunities for transparency, and efficiency into the rate recovery process. Delmarva is not seeking any rate recovery in this application, but it does seek to change the traditional rate base rate of return ratemaking process.

On July 31, 2024, in Order No. 10504, the Commission established a process to consider Delmarva's application pursuant to *26 Del. C. § 201(e)*.

On October 29, 2024, Delmarva filed a Supplemental Application with Testimony to support its request for the Commission's consideration under *26 Del. C. § 201(e)*.

The Commission will make its decision on this matter on the basis of the record evidence taken at a public evidentiary hearing. The Commission may approve or reject, in whole or in part, the proposed application.

You are invited to review Delmarva's application and supporting documents to determine how your interest may be affected by going to DelaFile (<http://delafile.delaware.gov>), the Commission's docketing and file management system, and by searching for Docket No. 24-0868.

If you wish to formally participate as a party in this matter, with the right to present evidence and be represented by counsel, you must file with the Commission a petition asking for leave to intervene in accordance with the requirements of the Commission's *Rules of Practice and Procedure* (26 Del. Admin. C. §1001-2.9) **on or before Wednesday, November 20, 2024**. All such petitions should be filed in DelaFile according to the Commission's rules (26 Del. Admin. C. §1001-1.6.4). Petitions filed after the deadline of November 20, 2024, will not be considered except for good cause shown.
