**PUBLIC NOTICE OF APPLICATION OF DELMARVA POWER AND LIGHT
COMPANY FOR APPROVAL OF ITS PROPOSAL TO ESTABLISH A NEW
AFFORDABILITY AND LOAD FLEXIBILITY PORFOLIO**

**TO: ALL ELECTRIC CUSTOMERS OF DELMARVA POWER AND LIGHT
COMPANY AND OTHER INTERESTED PERSONS**

On December 9, 2025, Delmarva Power and Light Company ("Delmarva") filed an application with the Delaware Public Service Commission ("the Commission") pursuant to 26 Del. C. §§201, 301, and 304, for approval of a proposal to establish a new portfolio of demand management programs including a bring your own device smart thermostat program, an air conditioning or heat pump cycling program, EV managed charging program, smart charge management program, EV-only time-of-use program, a whole home time-of-use rate, a bring your own battery pilot, and a locational demand response pilot.

On January 7, 2025, the Commission opened this docket to consider Delmarva's Application.

The Commission will make its decision on this matter on the basis of the evidence of record taken at a public evidentiary hearing(s), notice of which will be published at a later date. The Commission may approve or reject the proposed portfolio of programs as a whole or in part.

Delmarva's customers and others are invited to review the Application and supporting documents. You may review the documents during normal business hours in the Commission's Dover office at the address listed below or on the Commission's website at www.depdc.delaware.gov. You may also review copies of the Application and supporting documents at the office of the Division of the Public Advocate located at the Carvel State Office Building, 4th Floor, 820 North French Street, Wilmington, Delaware 19801. If you wish to formally participate as a party in this matter, with the right to present evidence and be represented by counsel, you must file with the Commission a written petition for leave to intervene in accordance with the requirements of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (26DeLAdmin. C. § 1001-2.9) on or before **January 30, 2026**. All such petitions should be e-filed according to the Commission's Rules (26 Del. Admin. C. § 1001-1.6.4). Petitions filed after the deadline, will not be considered except for good cause shown.

Interested persons may file objections to the proposed rate changes and the accompanying proposed tariff revisions set forth in the Application. Such objections or written comments shall be filed on or before February 6, 2026, using the Commission's file management system, DelaFile (<https://delafile.delaware.gov>), and by searching for Docket No. 25-1554. You are invited to review Delmarva's Application and supporting documents to determine how your interests may be affected by going to DelaFile (<https://delafile.delaware.eov>), the Commission's file management system, and by searching for Docket No. 25-1554.
